



AIMS 12 LIFE-SAVING RULES (12 LSR)

The life-saving rules have been created to keep AIMS premises as a safe workplace. We have analyzed the activities which hurt us the most and developed the life-saving rules to help prevent injuries in the future. Implementing AIMS 12 Lifesaving Rules requires a shared understanding of the importance of the rules and their necessity to ensure everyone goes home safely, every day.

The Life Saving Rules (LSR) not only applied to site-based personnel but also to everyone, at all levels, all the time, including our sub-contractor, visitors, and office-based staff. These rules must be understood and adhered to by all. While the criticality for these rules at operations is obvious, office-based employees should also be aware as they too are exposed to several hazards and contribute to promoting the rules to others. All AIMS employees are empowered to intervene if there is any LSR violation.

Pre-job planning

- Are we doing any work today involving a Life-Saving Rule?
- How can we follow the Rule from start to finish?
- What needs to be in place?
- Is everything in place, and in good working condition?



Last minute risk assessment

- Have I done all the Life-Saving Rules actions?
- Is everything as we discussed in the pre-job planning?
- Are there any Line of Fire hazards or ignition sources we didn't identify?



Post-job reviews

- Did we take all the actions associated with the Life-Saving Rules?
- What went well?
 What didn't go well?
- Anything to note for the next time we have to this perform task or work in this area?



Observations & walkabouts

- Do you see anyone performing work where a Life-Saving Rule is relevant?
- Are they following the Rule?
- Yes? Great, recognise it!
- · No? Intervene!
