BEHAVIOURAL SAFETY- WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR SAFETY?

Who is responsible for safety?

Safety is everyone's responsibility!

As an employee you should:

- ❖ Learn to work safely and take all rules seriously.
- ❖ Recognize Hazards and avoid them.
- ❖ Report all accidents, incidents, injuries to your supervisors immediately.
- ❖ Inspect tools before use to avoid injuries and incidents.
- ❖ Wear all assigned Personal Protective Equipment's.
- ❖ Refer safe work procedures prior to start the work.



On the other hand, it's management's responsibility:

- ❖ The health, safety, and welfare of all workers is primary responsibility of management.
- ❖ Provide a safe and Healthy workplace.
- ❖ Provide personal protective equipment's.
- ❖ Train employees to work in safe procedures and identification of Hazards.



Always use protections that are provided on the job:

- ❖ Guards on machines & tools keep body parts from contacting with moving equipment.
- ❖ Insulation on machines prevent burns, shocks & fire.
- ❖ Lockout/Tagout assures the equipment is de-energized before it is repaired.
- ❖ PPE's shield's your body from hazards you face on the job.
- ❖ Good ventilation helps to maintain sufficient oxygen workplace.

Consequences of unsafe behavior:

Everyone must be aware about potential hazards on the job:

- ❖ Poor housekeeping results in slips, trips & falls.
- ❖ Electricity can cause shock if not handled properly.
- ❖ Improper manual handling and cause back problems or other injuries.
- ❖ Tools & equipment's can harm if not guarded properly or protective device is disengaged.
- ❖ Improper use of PPE's can result in incidents and accidents.

In case of Emergency:

- ❖ Understand alarms and evacuation routes.
- ❖ Follow site emergency response procedures for safe evacuation from site.
- ❖ Wipe up spills promptly and correctly.

Safety benefits everyone. With fewer injuries, a business can be more productive and profitable. By incorporating safety rules, employees avoid injury as well as illness from exposure to Hazardous substances.
